About Marathwada Region

There are total eight districts in Marathwada region comprising of total 76 Talukas (Blocks) .The eight districts are Jalna, Aurangabad, Parbhani, Hingoli, Nanded, Latur, Osmanabad and Beed. This Marathwada region was once part of the erstwhile kingdom of the Nizam of Hyderabad. The total area occupied by the Marathwada region is 64590 km2,

As per 2011 census total population of this region was 187 Lakhs. Around 80% of the population depends on agriculture for their livelihood and about 70 % of the Agricultural land is rain fed. further around 50% of the population lives under BPL.

Weather of the region normally is dry and hot. Further this has historically been a rain shadow region, rainfall has been always in the range of 750- 800mm. In recent past, Marathwada has been facing exceptionally cruel weather. June-September Monsoon, which is the lifeline of most of this rainfed region, has been playing truant. Around 60% of the region always prone to drought. The forest comprises around 4% of the total land,

As compare to other regions, Marathwada is most back ward area in Maharashtra.

The literacy rate of Marathwada region is the lowest in the State (51.23%, Census 2001). All eight districts figure in the list of the 100 poorest districts in the country.

Except Aurangbad, and to some extent Jalna , all other districts are hardly having any big industrial estates.

As compare to other region in Maharashtra, Marathwada is far lagging behind in case of basic infrastructure and essential amenities like road, schools, health facilities and employment opportunities etc.

As per 2011 census, the per capita income in the region was Rs,14227 and human development index is 42. Majority of the women are far away from main stream.

Effective Water Management will definitely make substantial contribute toward achieving the goal of sustainable development of the region. Hence we feel that some concentrated and constructive efforts, especially in the field Water Management are very much essential.

Water and Sustainable Development

Inspired with the Gandhian concept of "Gram Swaraj",we strongly believe that, the effective and systematic management of natural resources like water, land, including animals, human beings and effective forest conservation is the only way to achieve sustainable rural development. In line with this ideology, we concentrate our efforts and are being selecting and implementing our different project.


Projects Implemented by our Organization during 2019-20

1. Rejuvenation campaign of Chiite River (Under Vasundhara IWMP-17)

Back Ground in short:- Chiitte River Basin is around 12 km away from Aurangabad, however this region, besides bestowed with ample natural resources, due to the lack of proper water management and concentrated efforts, was always being attracted acute drought, .Also people in the area were not much ambitious and were making hard efforts to support their livelihood by supplying fire wood and animal fodder to nearby area. Road condition was very poor, The endless water shortage, affected the life of peoples adversely, especially the women were having most significant adverse effect on their life, also the lack of sufficient fodder in the area reduced the livestock in the area. There was huge migration from the area for job hunting. The 2012 Drought gave a significant impact on the life of farmers and most of them were forced to **destroy their horticultural and** also were compelled to sale out their livestock.

About Chitte Basin:- Chitte River basin admeasuring around 6427 hectors, is 12 K.M. away from Aurangabad toward the west. This basin encompasses 12 villages, like village Sindon, Bhadon, Ekod, Pachod, Chittegaon etc. and include total 19 micro Watershed. This 17 K.M. river water has its impact on the livelihood and in turn on life of around 15000 villagers living in this area. The Land layers in this area found to consists of Black and Manjrya Rock and Red Bol.

The height from Sea level ranges between 537 M to 793 M. The project area comprises of waste land and forest land to a vast extent .Total land under irrigation was 421 hector.



In the year 2015-16 the rejuvenation plan of Chitte river was finalized in presence of honorable Mr. Haribhu Bagde. We also have an honor of Minister of Rural Development Pankajatai Mundhe being present on the occasion of the actual commencement of the project work..

Main Aim of the project:- To develop a self sustainable, self sufficient and Sustainable cluster by optimum utilization of available natural resources in the region.

Main objective of the project

- 1. To make sincere effort towards enhancing the living standard of peoples in project area by optimum exploitation of available natural resources.
- 2. To provide capacity building skill development trainings to the land less peoples in the area for self employment also to provide some working capital to them for commencing some productive activity in line with the training provided to support their livelihood.

Special activities implemented under Vasundhara IWMP-17 project in the financial year 2019-20

Visits to Chitte River Rejuvenation Campaign

- 1) Chitte River Rejuvenation Campaign was implemented at Ekod with the initiative of Gramvikas Sanstha. As a result, the Chitte River Valley experienced prosperity in water. On 28/11/2019, 28 selected farmers by Walmi from Maharashtra visited Ekod-Pachod. During the visit, Bapurao Bhosale, an activist of Gramvikas Sanstha, inspected the work done under the watershed project in Ekod village and gave information about the Chitte River Rejuvenation Campaign. Also, young farmer Sachin Khade gave detailed information about the benefits under the actual watershed project and gave detailed information about plantation of grape and citrus orchards. The farmers expressed their satisfaction by inspecting Ekod village.
- 2) On 12/12/2019 'Jaldut's' visit was organized by Walmi Sanstha at Ekod village. During the visit, Jaldut inspected Chitte river widening, deepening, cement nala dam, farms, deep CCT, shednet, orchard, vegetable. Also visited farmer's Sachin Khade vineyard. On this occasion, farmer Ashok Khade informed about the head to foot watershed treatment work. Also, the representative of the organization Baburao Bhosale, Balaji Biradar gave detailed information about the work done so far in Chitte river valley. Finally, the envoy expressed satisfaction by inspecting the Adarsh school program.

Special activities implemented under Vasudhara IWMP-28 project in the financial year 2019-20

This year, the work of NRM under Vasundhara (IWMP-28) Udgir project is 80. Work worth Rs. 54.99 lakhs was done on compartment bunding, Sinaba(03), farms(04) etc. Also, under the 9 percent subsistence scheme, 83 women self-help groups and 19 landless beneficiaries were allotted with Rs.22.85 lakh only, and 22.85 lakh beneficiaries including their public contribution a total of Rs.45.80 lakh were spend on buying cattles, sewing machines, grocery stores and other such items for the beneficiaries.

Under the 10 per cent subsidy, 146 beneficiaries were allotted Rs 34.07, and with people's contribution of Rs. 34.07 lakh a total of Rs. 68.14 were spent by beneficiary on motors, cattles and other items. In addition, Rs. 5.42 lakh was deposited in the watershed development fund account through this project in the form of contribution.

- 2. Increase in the ground water level by 3-4 Meter in 125 wells.
- 3. Irrigated land area increased up to 2308 Ha.
- 4. Increased Employment opportunities for local youths.

Water Conservation Projects taken up under different funding agencies assistance:-

Project Name: - Sakal Water Conservation Project Gevrai Kuber - Khodegaon

By the initiative of Gramvikas Sanstha on 23rd April 2019 at Gevrai Kuber and Khodegaon village (Ta. Dist. Aurangabad) 16,660 cubic meters of river widening and deepening was done for water conservation which costed Rs.4,50,000/- (Rs. 4 lakhs from Sakal Relief Fund and 50 thousand from people's contribution). Due to the related work, the water storage capacity has been increased by four crore fifty lakh forty eight thousand liters. This work has benefited about thirty wells in the nearby area and has increased the ground water level. The use of drip irrigation by the farmers in the area has doubled the agricultural production and income.

Sakal provides financial help to the villages selected by Gramvikas Sanstha every year for the water conservation work. Sakal Relief Fund has assisted 8 villages till now.

The innaugration ceremony for the Gevrai-Kuber water conservation work was held under the presence of Ranjit Khandare(news editor of Sakal Marathwada edition), Dr. TR Patil(director of Raseyo), Narhari Shivpure (Secretary of Gramvikas Sanstha), Dr. Sheikh Parvez, Sarpanch Digambar Kuber, Bhausaheb Mate, Tanishqa members -Kuntabai Kuber, Manipa Vaishnav and Rameshwar Kuber .A large number of Tanishqa members, women from the village of Panchkoshi were present on the occasion.

Project Name: - Anulom Water Conservation Project Pardari - Sindon - Ekod

Under the initiative by Gram Vikas Sanstha, in collaboration with Anulom, in the village of Pardari, Sidan, Ekod (Ta. Aurangabad) silt removal from Pazar lake was done for drought alleviation. Rs.3.5 lakh were spent on this work which benefited around 25 wells in all the three villages by increasing the ground water level. Also the siltation which covered 40 hecters of land benefitted farmers for kharib ,perennial farming for the irrigation purpose.

Adarsh Gram Project Village Wava:-

Project Objectives:-

- 1. To contribute in enhancing the standard of living of local people, through integrated Management of natural resources like Land Water Soil, Plants Animals including Human beings.
- 2. <u>To Follow the Seven Principles (Saptapadi)</u> like 1) Prevention of Grazing, 2.Prevention of tree cutting, 3.Prevention of Intxication, 4.Voluntry contribution in physical project work. 5. Family panning, 6) prevention of open defectaion and 7) Water Budgeting.
- 3. Providing capacity building trainings to rural youths under skill development program and provide some working capital for commencing livelihood activities.
- 4. To provide infrastructural facilities and basic amenities in targeted villages.

Main Components of the Project

- 1. Effective Natural Resource Management.
- 2. Capacity Building Training.
- 3. Skill Development training to Landless peoples to make them able for self employment and to provide them some working capital for commencing own livelihood activity.
- 4. To provide basic infrastructure and amenities.

About the Vava villages:-This village is from Paithan Block of Aurangabad District. It is located around 40 K.M. from Aurangabad towards the South direction on Aurangabad Paithan road, and around 4 km away from village Dhangaon towards East.

Gramvikas Sanstha with intention to give the "form of peoples movement" to the Gandhian concept rural development with self sustained, self dependant self governed villages, implemented an ambitious project named "Apla Vikas Aplya Hati" i.e. our development with our own efforts. As a virtue of this project the Govt. of Maharashtra selected this village for development under Adarsh Gram scheme.

Under this project during the year 2017-18 following works were taken up and completed.

- Compartment bunding on 200 hector land.
- Construction of total 07 Cement Nala Bandh,(03 under this project and 04 under other departments.)

As a consequence of these interventions, sufficient water was made available to farmers and facilitated them to take both the crops i.e. Rabbi and Kharip by using drip irrigation, and ultimately resulted in enhancing the farmer's income by double. Total population of this village is 700 and area under Watershed is 721 hectors.

Along with above specified works .Rs.184356803 have been utilized under this project and remarkable work has been done under major subject like Water Management, Education, Health, Agriculture, Environment Development, Skill development, Adolescent Girl development, Animal Husbandry and diary development

Special undertaking:

• The Gas connection made women's life easier.

The women in the village collect wood from farms/forest and even livestock dung for the kitchen use. There is a risk of respiratory illness due to smoke and deforestation is detrimental to the environment as well as a lot of time and labor of these women who work at farms is wasted to bring this fuel. In order to save all this, by the initiative taken by Gramvikas Sanstha working at Gram Panchayat Pardari, the representative of the organization and the villager's motivator gave detailed information about the Pradhan Mantri Ujjawala Gas Yojana and also emphasized the importance of using gas. Followed up to get the plan to the concerned department. The concerned department has provided proper help to the beneficiaries to get gas connection. With the connection of gas under Pradhan Mantri Ujjawala Yojana, cooking has become easier for the women of Pardari village and their life has become smoke free and easy. Up till now 26 families have received the gas connection. The joy of getting rid of the smoke is clearly visible on the faces of the women class.

Training & Research

Marathwada is a backward region in comparison to other parts of Maharashtra and at the national level. 


